- Resident Assessment Instrument (RAI)
 - Minimum Data Set (MDS)
 - Resident assessment protocols (RAPs)
 - Utilization guidelines from the State Operations Manual

- highly regulated
- standard data set that is easily automated
- in workflow issues it is similar to acute care
- budgets are lower
- decision making demands are less
